US sanctions 32 entities, individuals from several countries, including India

The US on Wednesday announced sanctions against 32 entities and individuals from several countries, including India and China for links to Iran's ballistic missile programme.

The US state department said the action is in line with President Donald Trump's efforts to counter Iran's aggressive development of missiles and other asymmetric and conventional weapons.

"At the direction of President Trump, we are putting maximum pressure on Iran to end its nuclear threat," he said.

"The United States also expects the international community to fully implement UN snapback sanctions on Iran to cut off its access to the global financial system," he added.

Yunus: Referendum on constitutional reforms

Bangladesh's interim government Chief Adviser Muhammad Yunus on Thursday announced that a referendum on constitutional reforms will be held alongside the general elections on the same day in February next year.

Yunus made the announcement in a televised address to the nation after the political parties failed to reach a consensus on the timing of the referendum despite multiple rounds

of discussions.

"After considering all aspects, we have decided to hold the referendum and the national polls on the same day - the first half of February next," he said.

Yunus said the Council of Advisers on Thursday approved the "July Charter Implementation Order, 2025".

"The (advisory council) order also pointed out that an arrangement will be made to incorporate the July Charter in the Constitution in line with the (political parties) commitment to implement it," he said.

Commemoration for Korean victims

South Korea will hold its own memorial ceremony next week to honour Korean victims forced into labour at a Japanese mine complex during Japan's colonial rule over Korea, the foreign ministry said Thursday.

This year's memorial, set for next Friday, is the second such event South Korea is hosting separately from the one organised by Japan as Seoul and Tokyo could not come to an agreement on ways to hold a joint ceremony.

South Korea boycotted the event hosted by Japan last year, citing Japan's lack of sincerity in honoring the victims, including its apparent rejection to reflect their sufferings and the nature of forced labour in the memorial speech, Yonhap News Agency reported.

Nepal forms task force for security ahead of polls

Election Commission of Nepal on Thursday held discussion with political parties representing federal parliament, province and local level regarding preparations for the upcoming National Assembly and House of Representatives elections.

Nepal's Minister for Home Affairs Om Prakash Aryal, on the other hand, said, a task force comprising representatives from all security bodies has been formed to prepare the election security plan.

The general elections are scheduled for March 5, 2026. The EC informed the representatives of various political parties about the election to the Upper House or National Assembly and proposed general election schedule on March 5 as well as voters' list updation programme.

The clauses of the amendment were already approved with two-thirds majority.
